#### Tal-y-Braich Finances;

The income, up to the March 2020, from Tal-y-Braich was substantially down this year. It has been suggested that in the main the weather was a contributory factor for this. The committee has decided to spend some monies on improvements in an attempt to attract our own members to use TyB.

The clubs finance balance is in reasonable condition as we have been in receipt of a 'small businesses' Government Covid grant. The committee are in the process of considering how this grant is best used. The committee has already issued rebates to club members where club failed events deposits were not returnable.



# Tal-y-Braich;

Much was done to Tal-y-Braich in an endeavour to comply with Welsh regulations in operating the hut and is now 'Covid-19' friendly – the Byre/Garage and the Cottage can now be used as two totally separate self contained accommodations. (Water stop taps are provided in each building).

The Byre kitchen area has been de-cluttered and upgraded, namely new crockery, cutlery, kettle, bowl, drainer and pan set.

NB The Byre is, generally, to be closed during the cold weather due to the potential freezing of water pipes. However, contact Mike G for details if you wish to use Byre!

- To seal and paint all concrete/slabbed flooring, to carpet tile the end bunk room floor.
- Replace one toilet cottage.
- Improvement to the lounge stove/flue in an attempt to stop smoke coming into the room.
